	Smell	Smell of intoxicating liquor; cannabis.
	Speech	Slurred words, incoherent speech, rambling conversation, loss of train of thought, difficulty in paying attention, difficulty in comprehending a conversation or instruction.
	Balance	Stumbling, falling into people or furniture, difficulty walking and/or standing, unsteady on feet, swaying uncontrollably, staggering.
	Coordination	Lack of coordination, spilling drinks and/or food, fumbling with change etc, difficulty opening doors or using mobile phones, glassy eyes and lack of focus, difficulty in putting glass or food to their mouth.
	Behaviour	Disorderly, aggressive, rude, offensive, annoying, loud, confused, overly exuberant, bad-tempered, threatening, drowsy /sleepy, threatening and/or physically violent or intimidating.
	Additional indicators	Presence of drug paraphernalia (such as syringes, swabs, tourniquets and/or devices for smoking drugs).
	Admission of consumption of alcohol or drug-taking	Admission by the person that they have consumed alcohol and/or drugs.
